10:00 a.m.-11:30 a.m. – **Franklin Park Conservatory** (Chihuly Reimagined) – Set within the 88 acres of Franklin Park, the Conservatory houses 400 species of plants from a variety of global climate zones and features the historic John F. Wolfe Palm House where more than 45 species of palms are represented among more than 120 individual specimens. See thousands of colorful glassworks by Dale Chihuly at Franklin Park Conservatory, the only botanical garden in the world with a permanent Chihuly collection. These works drew a record number of visitors to the conservatory when they were first shown from October 2003 to July 2004. In addition, several new Chihuly works will be on display.

12:00 noon-2:30 p.m. – **Ohio Historical Society and Ohio Village** – Dickens of a Mystery and Buffet Lunch – Did you ever wonder what happened to Scrooge after his Christmas morning reformation? You are in store for a grand surprise in



this production of *Dickens of a Mystery*. As you partake in a holiday lunch buffet, complete with Mrs. Cratchet's famous plum pudding, you will interact with characters from "A Christmas Carol" and then be asked to help solve the mystery. **Campground:**

Activities will be centered around the Cross Creek Camping Resort in Delaware, Ohio. From the north: Take exit 131 on I-71, west 3 miles on US-36/SR-37 to Lackey Old State Road, turn south 3.2 miles to campground (right turn). From the south: Take exit 121 on I-71, west on SR-750 1.6 mile to Old State Road, turn north 5.7 miles to campground (left turn).

Please make your own reservations with the campground. Rates for 50-amp, water, and sewer are \$36 for weekdays and \$40 on weekends. We were offered a 10% Good Sam discount. For reservations phone: (740) 549-2267.
